

Monroeville's Compunetics wins \$4.5 million NASA contract

Compunetics Inc. has won its second multimillion-dollar job from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration — a \$4.5 million contract for a sophisticated communications network linking ground control and space flights.

The contract, announced by the Monroeville-based firm yesterday,

calls for a voice/data link between manned and unmanned flights and 700 "highly intelligent telephones," each with an internal computer, which Compunetics will design and manufacture. Many of the phones will include electroluminescent screens — the flat display screens used by laptop computers — with touch-screen controls that will enable users to organize conference calls of almost unlimited size. By touching the screen, users also can

perform functions such as conversing with one party while monitoring another conversation, said Mike Kancel, engineering manager.

The system will also be linked with the communications switching network which Compunetics is building under a \$4 million NASA contract awarded last year. That system, which is expected to be in operation next summer, is designed to link 2,000 people scattered around the globe in one conference call or

any configuration — such as 200 conference calls involving 10 people each or 500 conference calls involving four people each.

The combination of the two systems "will form the communications core of NASA's worldwide Mission Control activities," according to Compunetics.

"It's like taking two octopi and stitching them together at the head," Kancel said.

The latest contract calls for a


voice distribution system to be operational at Goodard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md., in 21 months. Transmissions will be digital, rather than the analog transmissions used by conventional phones which will increase the transmission capabilities of NASA's existing phone lines, Kancel said.

A digital transmission breaks down the human voice into discrete numbers prior to transmission, then converts the numbers back into

sound at the receiving end. An analog transmission sends continuous electronic signals. As with compact disks in a home stereo system, which use digital technology rather than the analog technology used in phonograph records, digital transmissions are clearer and less prone to distortion.


